Our Lady of Mount Carmel

And the Brown Scapular

Our Lady appeared to St. Simon Stock, the first Prior General of the Carmelites in Europe, in 1251 and held out the brown scapular which she offered to Carmelites as a pledge of her protection; "whoever dies piously clothed in the scapular shall not suffer eternal fire, rather he shall be saved."

The scapular consists of two pieces of brown wool cloth connected by two pieces of string that are worn over the shoulders so that the pieces of cloth rest on both the front and the back of the wearer. It is its own garment, signifying Mary's mantle, worn underneath regular clothing.

All who wear the scapular and practice the spirituality of the Carmelite Order have some affiliation with the Order. This spirituality is characterized by:

1. Frequent participation in the mass.
2. Frequent reading and meditation on sacred scripture.
3. A liturgical life grounded in the prayer of the church
4. Imitation of and devotion to Mary
5. The practice of the virtues, notably charity, chastity, and obedience to the will of God.

Anyone can be invested in the brown scapular by a priest, deacon, or authorized representative through a ceremony of enrollment.

Mary teaches us by her example and devotion to the scapular:

1. to be open to God and to His will, shown to us in the events of our lives.
2. to listen to the Word of God in the Bible and in life, to believe in it and to put into practice its demands
3. to pray at all times as a way of discovering the presence of God in all that is happening around us.
4. to be involved with others, being attentive to their needs.

The scapular is not:

1. A magical charm of protection
2. an automatic guarantee of salvation
3. an excuse for not living up to the demands of the Christian life.

The brown scapular is:

1. A sign which has been approved by the Church for nearly eight centuries.
2. A sign of our decision to follow Jesus like Mary.
3. An association with the spirituality of the Carmelite Order.

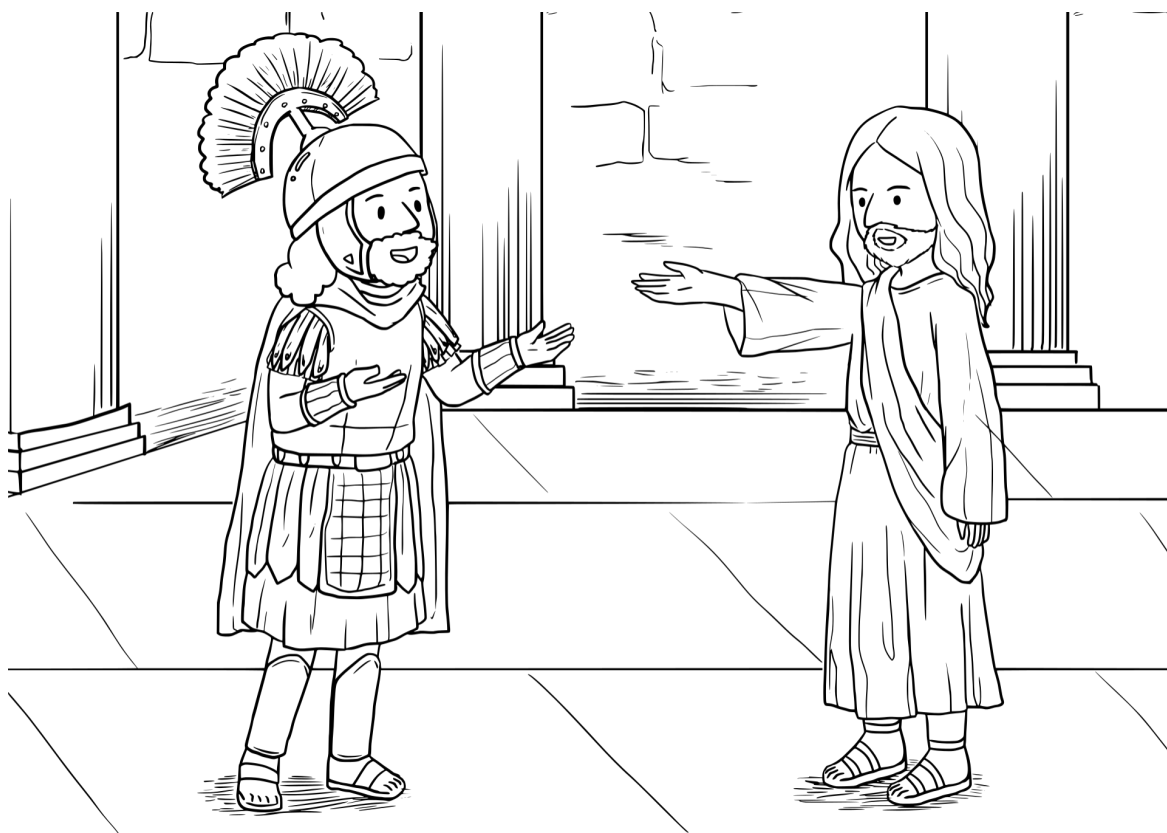

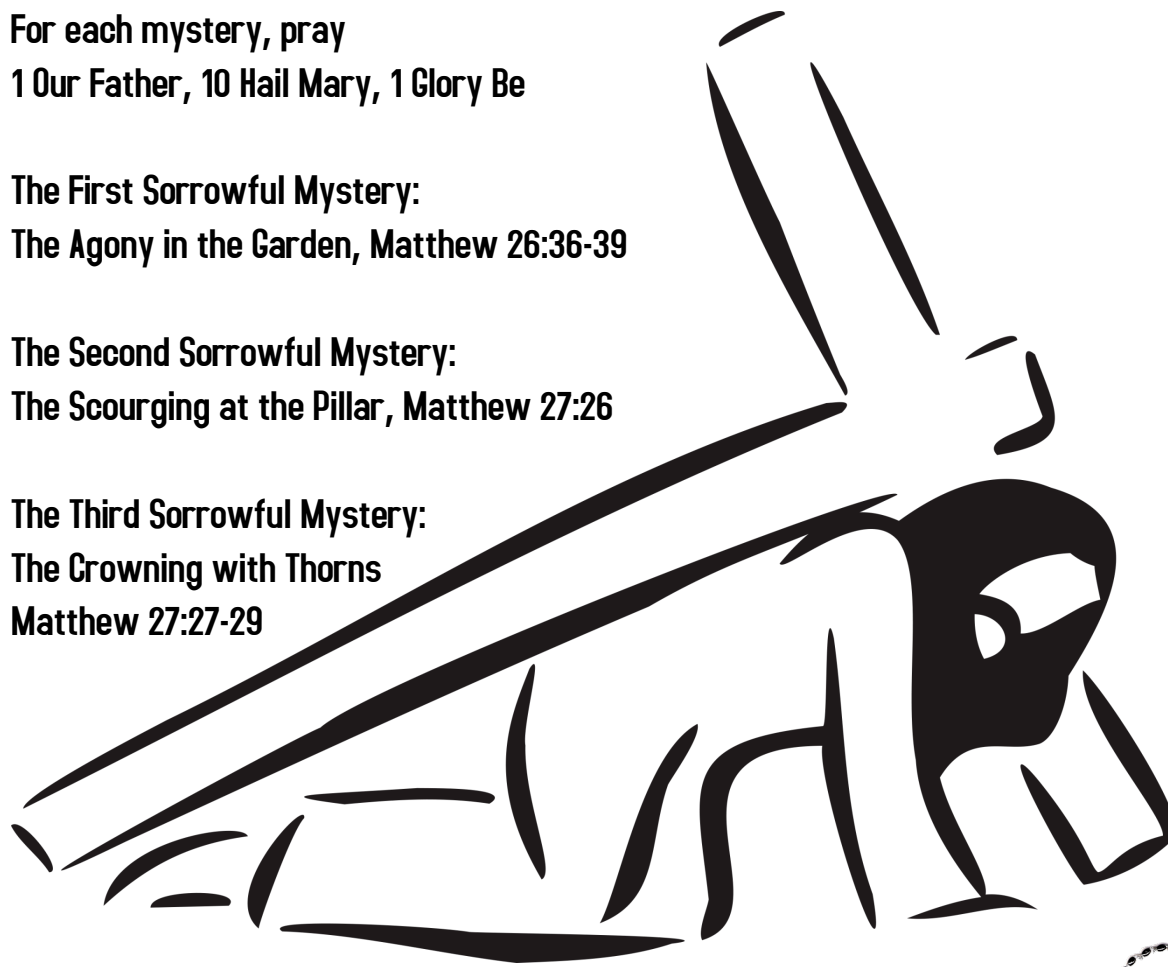

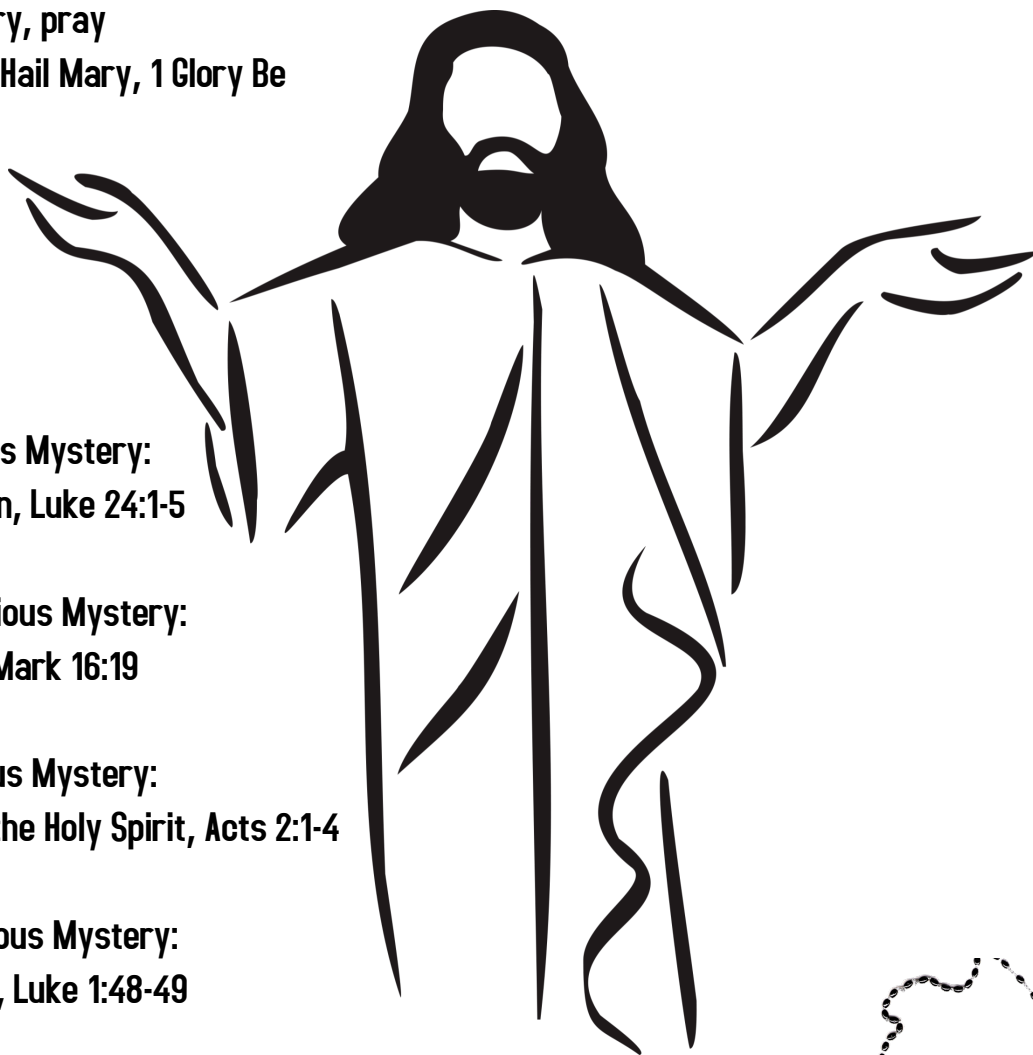

What would Mary fix for Jesus?

Try a modern recipe for ancient food.

In the Middle East during Jesus' day, people ate foods that are still familiar to us today. Tilapia, lamb, lentils, cabbage, parsley, mint, red wine, and olive oil may even be in your kitchen now. Try one of these modern recipes for ancient foods!

Breakfast Buffet A good start, then and now

Choose a few of these delicious, nutritious items and arrange them on a beautiful platter so everyone can help themselves: pita bread (whole grain), mixed olives (Mediterranean blend, black and green), plain Greek-style yogurt, honey, figs, pomegranates, grapes, apricots, dates, almonds



Lentils with Rice A modern recipe for an ancient food

1 cup uncooked lentils

4 cups water

1 large onion (yellow, white, or red)

½ cup olive oil

1 teaspoon pepper

1 teaspoon cumin

1 tablespoon salt

1 cup uncooked rice

Step 1 Rinse the lentils and put them in a pot with 4 cups of water. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat to medium and cook 15 – 20 minutes. **Step 2** While the lentils start cooking, chop and sauté the onion in the olive oil. Pour the mixture of onion and olive oil into the pot with the lentils. Add the seasonings and rice into the pot with the lentils. **Step 3** Cover the pot and continue cooking for 20 – 25 minutes more, stirring from time to time. You will know it's done when the lentils are cooked and the rice is fluffy. Serve on a platter with a garnish of parsley or mint. It's delicious hot or cold. If you like, you can squeeze a little lemon on top. Serve with a side of salad, pita bread, and plain yogurt, or use the lentils as a filling for lettuce wraps.

MAKE A WOODEN CROSS

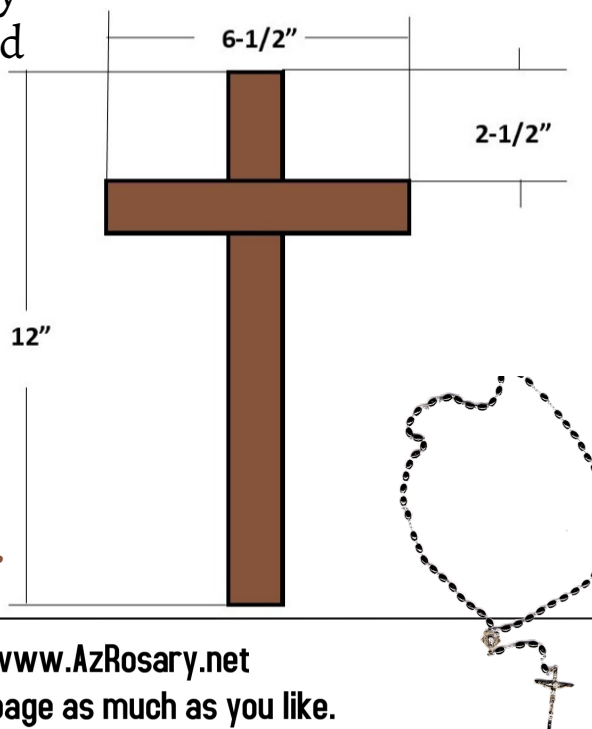
A project for adults Create a wooden cross for your home. You need to be familiar with some power tools, such as a table saw, palm sander, and drill.

Get some wood. Go to a hardware or lumber store to select your wood. Pine is an easy wood to work with. It should be one-and-one-half inches wide by twenty-four inches long.

Measure and cut. Your first cut should be twelve inches long. Your next cut will be six-and-one-half inches long. On the twelve inch board measure down two-and-one-half inches from the top and draw a line across that board. Center the six-and-one-half inch board on the twelve inch board at the two-and-one-half inch line. Then, draw lines on the boards where they intersect.

Fit and finish. Now comes fitting the two boards together. Set your table saw so it cuts only halfway through the thickness of the boards. Cut out the wood between the two lines on each board. When they are put together, they should be flush with each other. Glue the two boards together. At this time, you may use a palm sander to smooth the wood together. Sand all surfaces of your cross. You may want to use some fine sandpaper to finish it off. Turn your cross to the back side and drill a hole partway through to be able to hang your cross on your wall. You can now prepare to put on a finish. It can be paint or wood stain.

Now your cross is ready to hang.



THE EVANGELIZERS

Are you in an infinity war? Get ready for your endgame: Heaven!

How to get strong: Pray in the morning, do your best all day, and pray at night. God will make you strong. You might like to make or buy a cross. Take it to church and ask Father to bless it. Put the cross on the wall or table by your bed.

How to get even stronger: Add sacrifice to your prayer. Make a decision to do without something you like, for example, dessert or music. Decide if you will make the sacrifice for an hour, a day, a week, or longer. Tell God that your sacrifice is for Him.



Finally, draw your strength from the Lord and from his mighty power. *Ephesians 6:10*

How to be an evangelizer: "Evangelize" means to share the good news of Jesus with other people. There are three good ways to be an evangelizer.

1. Pray.

Say this prayer:

"Holy Spirit, come into my heart."

Pray for people to know Jesus, love Him, and live forever in Heaven.

2. Live a holy life. Read the Bible, go to church, love and forgive. People will see how you live and love. They will learn from your example.

3. Tell people about Jesus.

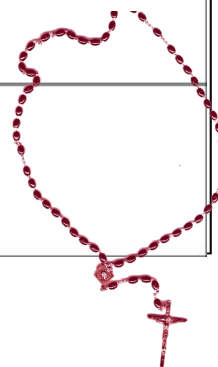


MOTHER OF MERCY, PRAY FOR US!

A Leader's Guide for Group Discussion and Prayer

In a group of family members, friends, or parishioners, talk about each of the three questions and take time to pray together for persecuted Christians. This activity is intended for adults, teens, and pre-teens.

Terms

A CHRISTIAN is someone who believes in the teachings of Jesus.
PERSECUTION could be defined as hostility or bad treatment of a person or group because of race, religion, or politics.

Suggested Format

Discussion could last one session or could be broken up into three different sessions. Start the session with prayer. You may wish to bless the room and yourselves with Holy Water. Ask the first question and allow discussion. After each person has spoken, offer background from this guide or from resources you have read on the topic. Proceed with the second and third questions. End the session with prayer.

Question 1 Why do people persecute Christians?

Background For as long as there have been Christians, there has been persecution of Christians. Jesus said, "If they persecuted me, they will also persecute you" (John 15:20). Unfortunately, there are people in this world who are very threatened by the idea that there is anything more than this world. A totalitarian regime cannot control people who have hope beyond this world.

Prayer God, we know you have a plan. It may not be what we have in mind, but You know what will happen in the future and we have hope that You are working everything together for good.
Jesus, we trust in You. Amen.

Question 2: Why does God allow this?

Background Everyone suffers. Humanity is in a fallen state, and we need Jesus. Jesus is our Savior because in His freedom, He took on death. Inherent in Christianity is the idea that faith is worth dying for, figuratively and literally. If Christians weren't being persecuted, that would mean they stand for nothing. If God did not allow free will, would we be able to choose Him freely and love him with our whole heart, soul, strength, and mind? God does not manipulate. The freedom that allows love, also allows suffering.

Prayer God, you are all good and deserving of all our love. Help us to understand Your will. Fill us with the grace and courage to choose love in all circumstances. Heavenly Father, we choose now to love You with our whole heart, soul, strength, and mind. Amen.

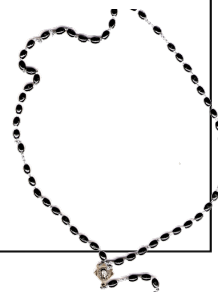

Question 3 What can we do about it?

Background Prayer is the first thing persecuted Christians ask us to do for them. Prayer. We can pray. And it doesn't stop there. Jesus taught us what to do: "But I say to you, love your enemies, and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust" (Matthew 5:44-45). Not only do we need to pray for persecuted Christians, we need to pray for people who persecute them. You may know people who are suffering for their Christian beliefs, or people who are treating them badly. Speak the truth – the fullness of truth. Talk about it. Don't give up on prayer, even if you can't see the change you pray for. God changes hearts. We don't make the change. Grace does. We also have an opportunity to learn from the mistake of persecutors. As humans, we all are in danger of judgmentalism. This is reason enough to pray and say the truth.

Prayer Heavenly Father, we pray that You will alleviate the suffering of persecuted Christians. We pray for persecuted Christians and their captors to be freed from evil influence. Thank you for the example of the Heavenly Martyrs. Thank you for the prophets, who suffered for the truth. Thank you for sending us your Son, who leads us all to you. Help us to stay close to you in prayer and give us courage to always say the truth. We make our prayer in the name of Jesus who is the way, and the truth, and the life. Amen.

As individuals and as a nation, we all have knots in our lives, problems and struggles for which we cannot see a solution. Certain situations, dilemmas, or mental disorders, no matter how large or small, require divine intervention. Christians of the apostolic faith have always known that the best prayer partner to have in this struggle is Mary, the Mother of Jesus and (as proclaimed by the Second Vatican Council) "Mother of the Church." As early as AD 180, Saint Irenaeus of Lyon, in his writings "Against the Heretics," first referred to the Virgin Mary as "The Undoer of Knots" because, in her obedience to the angelic invitation to become the mother of the Savior, Mary undid the knot that Adam and Eve tied by their disobedience. Thus, the title of Undoer of Knots is perhaps one of the oldest and most profound titles given to the Blessed Virgin Mary.



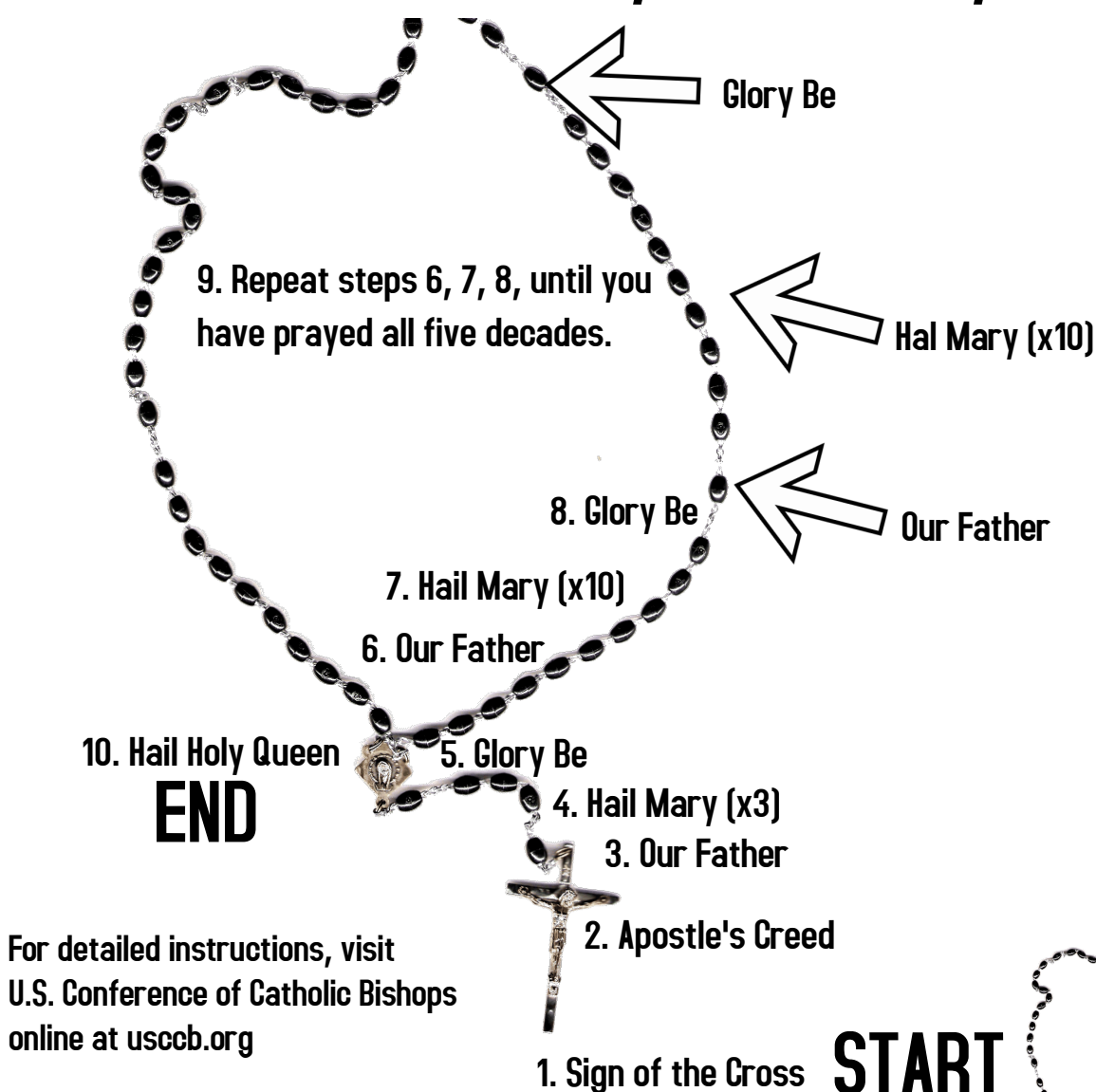
